Tong Wee is studying engineering at NUS. Design is just a hobby for him. When he saw the contest for our logo, and what it should try to show, "I just got pretty lucky," he said. "I wanted to use water droplets to symbolize the 'clean and green' we all want. And the droplets looked like 'J' and 'C'. That's how the idea came about!"

In his submission he explained how the C and J water droplets and the two leaves represent the clean and green environment the Town Council works to achieve. Together the two letters form a shape that symbolizes the unity among the communities within Jurong-Clementi. "And the two buildings within the enclosed contour signify the residents within the town living together harmoniously."

The judges liked his submission and the many symbols it contains. After some discussions with them, Tong Wee reduced the number of colours in his winning design to the three you see above.

his roof top "Sky Garden" gets hot on a sunny day. So the gardeners you saw on the front cover usually work here from seven to nine in the morning or after six in the evenings.

Now there is a lift they can use instead of six flights of stairs. And The Town Council installed a gate and CCTV camera "so no one can take the fruit of our labour," said Mdm Kamisah Atan, leader of Jurong Central's Zone D Garden Interest Group.

It's a very mixed group, with members from at least seven countries of all ages – the oldest being Mdm Kow Lang at 88!

They grow flowers and a lot of veg-

etables. "Anyone is welcome to come and work with us – or help us decorate the place." But it's not easy work.

his estate was built in 1984 and a garden was set up here ten years later. There's a long neighbourhood park next to Block106 and the garden became neglected. Then Mdm May

Lee took leadership of the Zone 2 Garden Interest Group . "Everyone has been inspired by her selfless and generous attitude," said Mr Hing, a member of the group.

The original Cozy Garden now has koi ponds, bonsai, amazing trellises and members have "created pieces of art to go with the plants," said Richard Ashworth, a sculptor who likes to work with recycled material. Lit like a fairyland by night, it has become a haven where residents wander, wind down, and socialize.

And the group has added two more gardens, a spectacular formal Culture and Arts Garden, and a Lush Garden featuring every fruit tree you can imagine. The group has won many awards, including one for bio-diversity. "We have lots of butterflies and fish, besides all the flowers, fruit, vegetables and herbs. Teachers from at least five kindergartens and childcare centres bring their kids here. They're here on most non-rainy days!" said Mdm Lee.

Asked what advice they would give anyone wanting to start a community garden, the members were unanimous. You need to have a good leader and you should look for a patron to help with all the expenses. And be creative, have an interesting layout.

3. Atop the Multi-Storey Car Park at Block 346A Kang Ching Road



his is not your average community garden with beds built on an unused part of the common area around the blocks. This is the aqua organic

system of urban farming. A maze of white pipes, 20m above ground, sprouting bright green leaves.

There is no weeding or watering to do here. To harvest the vegetables and herbs, you just pull them out of the planting material in the growing tubes. To plant, you just push the seedlings in. A trickle of water, rich in organic plant food, flows through the tubes to feed the plants.

Because it is always moving, the water provides no breeding place for mosquitoes. And the nutrients in it are organic. So the herbs and vegetables that grow here have none of the chemicals commonly used to grow the plants we eat.

"It's all about the 'S's," said Mr Teo Hwa Kok, Chairman of Citiponics, the company that manages this urban farm. "This method makes farming Simple. It produces food that is free of pesticides, that's Safe. The way we extract the organic nutrients for this system is Sustainable. Our methods provide a Secure food source. A simple, safe, sustainable system can have a huge Social effect!"

That was why Taman Jurong Zone D RC and Youth Chapter initiated this urban farm. The pilot test was successful and DPM Tharman officiated at the first harvest.

What was a bare roof is now an amazingly efficient vegetable farm where residents can pick what they want, fresh, and know it's clean, safe – and truly organic.

Heart trouble



Free Electrocardiogram (ECG Test) A patient lies on a couch for a few minutes while the ECG machine measures the electrical impulses that cause the heart to beat via contacts taped to arms, legs and chest. With the ECG results, a doctor can evaluate the heart's condition, recommending follow-up if needed.

Weak bones



Free Peripheral Bone Density Test requires no special preparation. The foot is placed in a small device that measure bone density in the heel in a few minutes. If high bone loss is detected it could indicate osteoporosis or a high risk of fractures and the patient will be referred to a Polyclinic for follow-up.

Viruses



Free Flu Vaccination – the best way to reduce the risk of getting sick with seasonal flu and spreading the virus to others. The flu vaccines cause antibodies to develop in the body that provide protection against the viruses that research indicates will be most common during this flu season.

Eye problems



Free Eye Check that can detect Cataracts, Glaucoma, Age-related Macular Degeneration, Diabetic Retinopathy and Ptergium. If a problem is found, patients will be referred to a Polyclinic for follow-up. These checks will be conducted at the Eagle Eye Centre in Westgate Mall. fter the fire incident on 11 October 2016, a new temporary market was set up to house 35 stalls at 495 Jurong West St 41. The new location, which was opened on 1 January 2017, was planned and built in just two months!

"We wanted the temporary market to be ready well before Chinese New Year. So we set the first of January as our target," said Mr Henry Ho, Chairman of Jurong Central CCC.

At the opening ceremony, MP for Jurong GRC (Jurong Central) Mr Ang Wei Neng thanked the various government agencies, contractors, donors, volunteers, etc., who had made the temporary market a reality.

He then announced that a new \$6m twostorey complex will be built by the HDB to replace the burnt-down market. It will have stalls and an eating house on the first floor and facilities for the community, especially the elderly, on the second.

Mr Tharman added that this was the Singapore Way. "When something unfortunate happens, everyone comes together



to make sure that we recover... and do something even better!" Mdm Chen opened her chicken stall at 6am that day. "I'm very happy. My old customers are back here to buy!"

Remember wheel chairs and ambulance crews need a clearway at least 1.2 metres wide. Make sure there's nothing in your corridor to block their way.

Never put anything down the rubbish chute that might set fire to the trash below.

O not store items inside the firemen's dryriser, wetriser or hosereel cupboards.

Remember the staircase and landings are your fireescape route - keep them clear at all times.

A Make sure there is nothing in the common areas around your flat that could catch fire.

📈 Always engage a licensed electrical worker (LEW) to perform all electrical installation, maintenance and repair work and ask to see his licence.

Switch off an electrical appliance before unplugging it from the mains.

When plugging in or unplugging an appliance, hold the plug, not the cord, to prevent damage to the cord.

Keep appliances such as decorative lighting chains, kettles and irons out of the reach of children. Replace damaged or frayed



cords immediately.





Use portable socket-outlets or install additional wall sockets.

Keep liquids away from your appliances and socketoutlets to prevent short circuits. Do not handle electrical appliances with wet hands.
